<b>Amlinelliad o'r bwriadau / Outline of intentions</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>Primary/secondary collaboration – staff will develop a shared understanding of the skills and knowledge gained in primary school, with a view to improving the transition into secondary school. English/Maths/Science will work with primary teachers to design Year 7 SoW.</b></li> <li>2. <b>Each HoF/DHT responsible for an AoLE will visit Pioneer schools to establish an understanding of how the new curriculum is being developed and implemented. Time will also be provided for leaders/teachers to share, develop and implement the new curriculum.</b></li> <li>3. <b>Develop the provision and capacity for developing and embedding the cross curricular responsibilities highlighted in the new curriculum through the appointment of a literacy co-ordinator. Initially, this will be a two year post.</b></li> <li>4. <b>Curriculum development time will be provided to each faculty, allowing them to work collaboratively in designing a programme of study based around the 'what matters' statements, and which provides students the opportunities to evidence the achievement outcomes.</b></li> </ol>
<b>Yr Effaith a'r Canlyniadau a Ddisgwylir / Expected Impact and Outcomes</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>The new Year 7 curriculum will reflect the priorities of the new curriculum and will provide students with an appropriate level of challenge following their primary school education. SoW will create a continuum of learning from primary into secondary education. Staff will have a good understanding of the standards achieved by students by the start of Year 7 and will be able to plan appropriately.</b></li> <li>2. <b>School leadership will have a clear understanding of how the new curriculum is being developed and will be able to plan appropriately for its implementation. The impact will be that the new Year 7 curriculum will reflect national priorities.</b></li> <li>3. <b>The impact will be that key literacy skills are embedded across the curriculum and students are provided with appropriate opportunities to develop their skills to a high level, across all AoLE's. All teaching staff will benefit from the support and guidance of the co-ordinator who will provide training and professional development.</b></li> <li>4. <b>The impact will be that all teachers contribute to the development of the new programme of study in their AoLE and have a good understanding of the new curriculum. Students will be provided with a high quality learning experience which develops both their subject knowledge and skills.</b></li> </ol>
